

MINUTES OF ST PHILIP'S AND ST JAMES' VESTRY MEETING 6 November 2017

8.00	Meeting opened with prayer	
1	<u>Minutes of previous meeting (26.9.17)</u> Approved Thanks were expressed to Toni for producing these.	
2	<u>Thanks for October</u> Tembu expressed his thanks to all those who had helped during his study month.	
3	<u>Treasurer's Report</u> Postponed in Jeremy's absence. Paul reported that this month's bake sale had raised £87 for The Yard. This will be reported in the news sheet on Sunday.	
4	<u>St James' Boiler Project</u> The tender from Lothian Heating is due to expire, so it was agreed that we should accept this and proceed. However, the estimated extras will take this well above the original £30,000 quote, a more likely total being £45,000. Jeremy is working on the funding bid, but the aim is to finance the project with: £5000 from church funds £20000 from loans/gifts from the congregation £20000 grant funding. Some of the total has already been paid out, and if a grant is not available we <u>could</u> cover the costs. Lucy Stewart, a qualified Conservation Architect, has been appointed as project architect, following recommendation. Listed Building Consent and the Building Warrant have been applied for. An asbestos survey has been carried out. Some low/medium risk areas were identified in the boiler room but thankfully not in the church. The consensus was that we should have this removed now (removal cost unknown), as there will be ongoing costs of monitoring it if not. A working party will be needed to clear the room (the old office upstairs) for the new boiler.	PS JH
5	<u>Church charity</u> It had been decided that for the next three years we would support one main charity (through giving and prayer), but continue with up to 3 others from the bake sales. In addition we will continue our support for the Basics Bank as we are currently their second largest source of donations. It was agreed to support the following three charities, suggested by members of the congregation: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Flying for Life • The Vine Trust • Edinburgh Cyrenians With our main charity being Edinburgh Medical Missionary Society (EMMS). It was felt this provided the right balance of local and overseas charities. Rosemary will contact the Mission Officer for EMMS to look at specific projects we could support.	RK

They would like to visit the Botanics and as the nearest church St James' would be most appropriate to provide a base for the day and a meal. It was agreed we would offer to do that, with a date to be arranged in the Spring.</p> <p><u>Lent courses</u></p> <p>Paul asked for a volunteer to host and another to lead one of the Lent groups for 2018. Ellie has already offered to lead/been volunteered. Rosemary offered to host.</p> <p><u>United Service</u></p> <p>It is St James' turn to lead the united service in January (Week of Prayer and Christian Unity). It was agreed this would be a non-eucharistic service (with people encouraged to attend St Philip's in the evening for communion.)</p> <p><u>Links with St Ninian's and St David's</u></p> <p>St David's are organising an Advent course on Old Testament passages relating to Christmas. Ruth's husband will be leading these, on Tuesday 5 and 12 December. Vestry members were encourage to support these, and to let Tembu know so that he could pass on numbers.</p>	
9	<p><u>Christmas Musical</u></p> <p>It has been decided to use Douglas' musical 'One Star' in place of a children's nativity at the service on 17 December. This will involve children and adults. Rehearsals to be arranged.</p>
